Did you know that car crashes are the number-one killer of teenagers in America? In response to this critical problem, over 15 years ago, the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) developed *Teens in the Driver Seat®* (TDS), a grassroots safe driving program, focusing exclusively on teen driver & passenger safety. Unlike any other teen safe driving program, TDS involves the target audience directly to help develop & deliver safety messages. Student volunteers run this program at their local school & TDS staff works with communities to bring together young drivers, parents, school administrators & other stakeholders to reduce teen driving fatalities and injuries. A detailed study indicated that the impact of the TDS program is an average reduction of 14.6% in teen crashes where the program has been sustained for 3 or more years.

TDS is just one part of the Youth Transportation Safety (YTS) Program that focuses on 3 major areas: 1) TDS-Jr. High, 2) TDS-High School and 3) UDS-College students. To date, the TDS program alone has successfully reached over 1,315 unique schools & almost 1.4 million teens in 38 states – and your state is one of them. Students in your community are actively working on this program and are working to keep your roads safer.

To further spread the life-saving TDS message, we are hosting a TDS Summit on May 19-21, 2018 in San Antonio, Texas. The TDS Summit showcases our student leaders in bringing awareness about this problem to their peers, their families & their community. Included at the Summit is the annual Teen Advisory Board in-person meeting https://www.t-driver.com/about-us/teen-advisory-board/, Teacher/Sponsor training, professional speakers, & our annual Awards Brunch, where we recognize outstanding high school and junior high school students & their teachers by presenting cash awards to top-tier TDS schools for their volunteer life-saving efforts.
