Pedestrian Safety Relay Race

Planning Hours: 1 hour

Best Time to Conduct: During Lunch, after school event, or in the classroom

Event Hours: 30 minutes minimum

This activity is to educate Jr. High and High School students on the dangers of walking distracted, safe bicycle practices, and to help increase awareness.

Items Needed

- Relay Race Cards (2 sets)
- Question and Answer key for announcer
- Timer (optional)

Steps

- 1. Print off the relay race cards on 8.5 x 11" sheets of paper and print off the question and answer key.
- 2. Lay out the large relay race cards face up 10-12 feet away from the starting line. Draw starting line with chalk or duck tape.
- 3. Make two teams for the relay. Teams can be up to 5 students.
- 4. One person will be the announcer and will ask the first players on the team a question from the Pedestrian Safety Q&A cards
- 5. The first players will run from the starting line to the relay race cards and find the correct answer to the question. The player runs back to the announcer and shows them their answer.
- 6. If the player chose the correct answer then they can tag in their next teammate. If they chose the incorrect answer then they must run back to the cards and grab the correct answer.
- 7. Repeat steps 4-6 until one team wins. The winning team finishes the relay first answering all questions correct.
- 8. Complete an activity form on t-driver.com for TDS All-Star points.
