INTRODUCTION

Too many teens are dying. You can help stop that.

While in junior high school, you'll probably never do anything more dangerous than drive a car — or ride in one that's driven by another teenager. Car crashes are the leading cause of injury and death for teens in America.

- About 2,700 teens per year are killed in crashes in the United States. (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA)) That's like loading up a school bus with teens and crashing it every week for an entire year!
- Crash rates for 16 to 19-year-olds is nearly 3 times the rate for drivers over 20. (Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS))
- Crash risk is the highest between ages 16-17.
 In fact, the fatal crash rate per mile driven is nearly twice as high for 16 to 17-year-olds as it is for 18 to 19-year-olds. (IIHS)
- Crash risk is particularly high during the first months of licensure. (CDC)
- For every teenager killed, more than 100 others are injured. (CDC)

SO...WHY IS THIS HAPPENING?

Simple — young drivers just don't have enough driving experience. In addition, most young drivers don't know the preventable dangers they face every time they get in the driver's seat. Since they are not aware of the dangers, they don't know how to avoid them. In just about every crash involving a young driver, you'll find common factors that contributed to the crash.

THE GOOD NEWS IS THESE INJURIES AND DEATHS CAN BE PREVENTED.

WHAT ARE THE COMMON FACTORS?

Graduated Driver Licensing laws encourage new drivers to get lots of driving experience in the safest conditions possible and avoid the following common crash factors:

- · Distractions, like cell phones and teen passengers
- · Driving at night and drowsiness
- · Speeding and street racing
- · Not wearing a seat belt
- Impairments, like underage drinking and drugs

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT IT?


Experts call this an epidemic, and they're right. It's out of control. But this program, Teens in the Driver Seat®, is turning things around, and your school can be part of it.

While other driving safety campaigns have been put together by adults telling you what you need to do, Teens in the Driver Seat is different.

This program is driven by teens, just like you, talking to other teens about the top five dangers and holding each other accountable to stay safe. With consistent messaging by you, Teens in the Driver Seat saves lives.

KEEP IT GOING

By getting the right message to others, you can help stop the epidemic that kills more teens in this country than any other cause. But, it's not a one-time effort.

It's not enough to get the right message out — you have to **get the message out time and time again** so that your classmates are reminded about the dangers and what to do about them.

Hold regular meetings with your sponsor and team. Plan and host activities throughout the school year. Report activities for All-Star points!

To get a better picture of the problem, distribute the TDS Survey and do Zero Crazy observations. Surveys are conducted annually, and Zero Crazy observations are a guided activity that focuses on seat belts and electronic use behind the wheel. The results will help your team pinpoint future outreach efforts.

This tragedy didn't become an epidemic overnight. We won't solve it overnight. The sooner you start, the sooner you can make a difference.

This is an activity that focuses on increasing seat belt use and decreasing electronic use behind the wheel. Information is sent at the beginning of each semester, then teams have until the end of the posted deadline to complete and return all observations. There is a pre-observation, three weeks of activities, and a post-observation. Information is sent in and the school receives a report on the habits they changed in their community, a gift card, and are awarded 15 TDS All-Star points. If your team completes both Zero Crazy seat belt and distractions activities, you will receive 40 points! At least one is required to win All-Star cash. www.t-driver.com/zero-crazy/

We know that since Teens in the Driver seat started in 2004, teens buckle up more (14%) and use their cell phones behind the wheel less (30%).
