

Impaired Driving Scenarios

Your friends convince you to attend a pre-prom party where alcohol is being served. You go and end up drinking a couple of beers.

What Would You Do?

Follow up:

Zero tolerance law makes it illegal per se (in and of itself) for persons under the age of 21 to drive with any measurable amount of alcohol in their blood.

Over the weekend, you were at your favorite aunt's house celebrating her birthday. While driving home, you notice that the car in front of you is driving slowly, breaking a lot, and swerving. As you get closer your mom points out that she believes it is a drunk driver.

What Would You Do?

Follow up:

Impaired drivers are people whose ability to drive safely has been reduced owing to the irresponsible use of drugs or alcohol. For that reason, you must give them plenty of room to predict their actions. The more you pay attention to them, the easier for you to detect impaired drivers from a fair distance. If you have the chance to pull over and place your vehicle in a safe spot, take note of their license plate number and call 911 to report the incident.
